# Part 1: Reading texts

### The Great Fire of London happens in 1666. What is the city like at this time?

- Around 500,000 people live in London in the 1660s. It is one of the biggest cities in the world. Only Paris and Constantinople (now Istanbul) are bigger.
- London is very crowded with narrow, dirty streets. Many of the houses are made of wood.
- At home, people use fires to cook with, and they use <sup>1</sup>candles for light.
- There is no <sup>2</sup>fire brigade to stop fires.
- There are a lot of rats and these animals spread illnesses like the plague. In the years 1665 and 1666, around 100,000 people die from the plague.

### Samuel Pepys Factfile

Samuel Pepys is the most famous person from the time of the Great Fire of London. We know many things about the Great Fire from his diary.

### Five things you can see today about the Great Fire of London

**1** Visitors to London can go to **Pudding Lane**. The great Fire starts here in 1666 in a baker's shop and there is a <sup>5</sup>plaque to show the shop's location.

**2** You can also visit **The Monument** near Pudding Lane. This tall column commemorates the Great Fire. It is 61 metres high and it has 311 steps to a <sup>6</sup>viewing platform over London. See it online at www.themonument.info

**3 The Museum of London** has an <sup>7</sup>exhibition about the Great Fire. There are old things in the museum from around the time of the fire. For example, there is an ancient fire bucket, and a huge painting of the fire.

4 One of the most important buildings to visit is **St Paul's Cathedral**. In 1666, the Great Fire destroys the old cathedral and a new one is built in the same place.

**5** Away from London, go to **The Pepys Library** in Magdalene College, Cambridge and see Pepys' real diary. It is written in code, so it isn't easy to read!


